

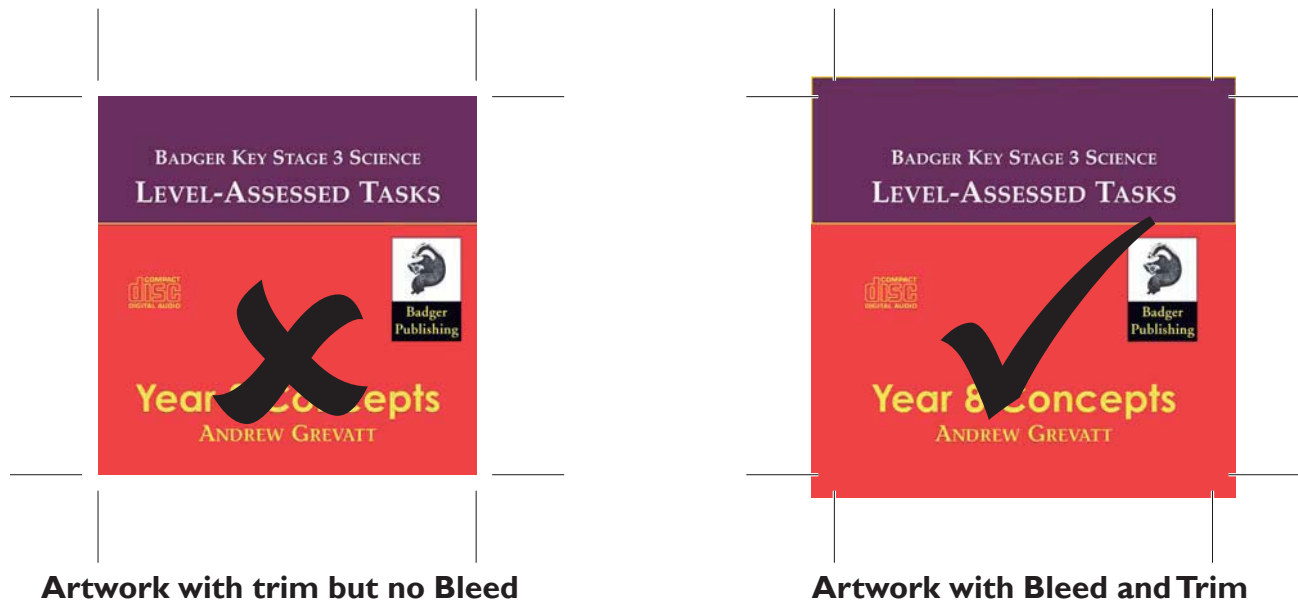
CD and DVD Paper Part Dimensions and Printing Information

Supplying your artwork in the correct format

In order for us to process your artwork efficiently and professionally, all supplied artwork for paper parts and packaging must have trim marks and bleed. Without this, processing your artwork will take longer, and ultimately the delivery of your finished discs may also be delayed.

What is Bleed?

Bleed is where your artwork is oversized to the required finished dimensions. Once your artwork is printed, it will need trimming to the finished size. For example if you have a picture that goes to the edge of the finished page, it will need to be 3mm larger on all sides so that when the page is trimmed to size there is no white space at the edge of the page. See the examples below:

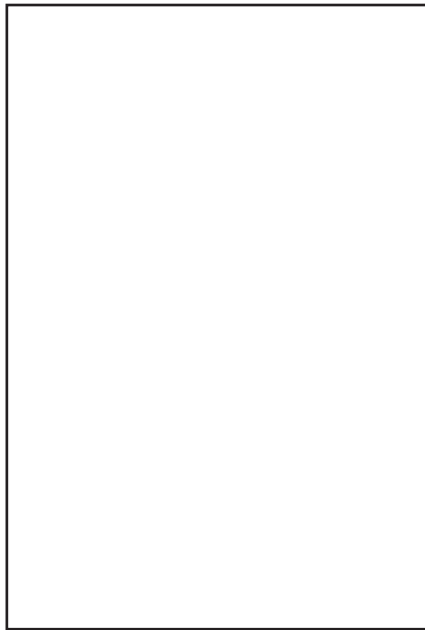
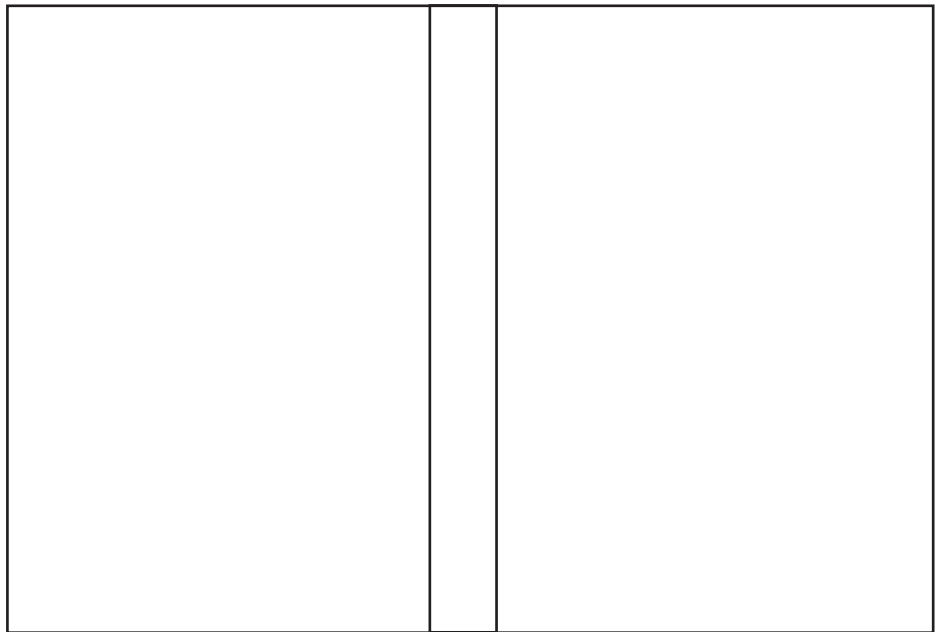

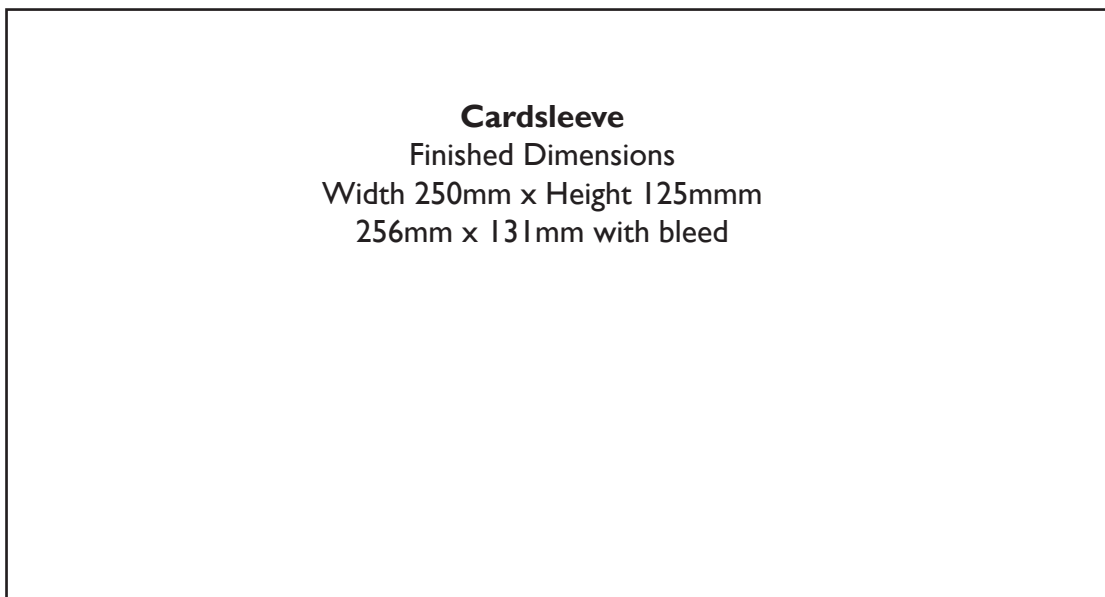
